

# 2009 Association of Montana Troopers Member Child Scholarship Recipients

Each year, the Association of Montana Troopers grants secondary education scholarships to legal sons or daughters of active duty or retired members in good standing. The scholarships are for \$1,000 and can be renewed for up to a total of \$4,000 or four years of secondary education.

In addition, the Association of Montana Troopers recently instituted a public scholarship for persons seeking a criminal justice degree from a Montana secondary education institution. The scholarship is also for \$1,000 and is not renewable.



and then pursue a career in international environmental development. □




