# Official Watch of the Montana Highway Patrol

The Fallen Troopers Fund has sup-

ported the families of troopers who have died in the line of duty, most notably paying for families and trooper escorts to attend Police Week memorial services in Washington, D. C.

Recently, Mr. Berghold decided to create custom timepiece to be made available to the public and contribute twenty percent of the sales proceeds year-round to the fund. The end result was dubbed the "Official Watch of the Montana Highway Patrol" and sports a scratch-proof sapphire crystal face and

stainless steel case with luminous hands and numerals. The watches are water resistant to 100 meters and are available with either a leather or stainless steel band.
